Recognizing March 31, 2026, as the International Transgender Day of Visibility.

Whereas, the International Transgender Day of Visibility holiday was founded in 2009 as a reaction to the lack of LGBTQIA+ holidays that celebrate the successes and accomplishments of transgender, non-binary, gender expansive, and gender nonconforming people; and

Whereas, the City of Minneapolis was the first city in the United States to have an openly transgender person serving as President of the City Council, having just previously made history as the first city in the United States to have two Black, openly transgender council members elected to its body; and

Whereas, Minneapolis was the first city in the United States to ban discrimination based on Transgender identity, 50 years ago, when it amended its Civil Rights Ordinance in 1975 by adding language banning discrimination based on “having or projecting a self-image not associated with one’s biological maleness or one’s biological femaleness”; and

Whereas, the City of Minneapolis has continued to make efforts to reduce the significant disparities in employment, healthcare, safety, housing, and access to public spaces, as well as all other areas, largely through the Transgender Issues Work Group, created in 2014, and the Transgender Equity Council, created in 2017; and

Whereas, in 2014, it's believed the City of Minneapolis was the first city in the nation to host a City-sponsored Transgender Equity Summit, an event drawing increased participation each year upwards of 400 attendees. In the fall of this year, the City of Minneapolis will proudly host the 11th Trans Equity Summit; and

Whereas, the Transgender Equity Summit is the result of the collaborative efforts of various City departments, cross governmental partners, community-based organizations, and community members rooted in the LGBTQIA+ communities of Minneapolis; and

Whereas, the establishment of the Transgender Equity Council, in 2017, a voluntary body comprised mostly of Minneapolis residents, has further enhanced community engagement and participation in the advancement of policies and procedures of the City of Minneapolis that impact the lives of Transgender individuals; and

Whereas, in 2022 the City of Minneapolis and in 2023 the State of Minnesota issued Executive Orders to protect and support the Rights of Minnesota's LGBTQIA+ community members to safely seek and receive Gender Affirming Health Care Services, and an accompanying bill was passed at the Legislature. In 2025 a new state law took effect requiring health plans that cover physical or mental health services to also cover medically necessary gender-affirming care; and

Whereas, our transgender and gender nonconforming community members both locally and nationally continue to be impacted by the proliferation of executive and legislative attacks that perpetuate a culture of discrimination, harassment, and barriers to equal opportunities for the Transgender community; and

Whereas, the city rejects and condemns in the strongest possible terms the horrific and discriminatory efforts of the federal government to erase the identity of transgender people and drive them out of public life; and

Whereas, it is incumbent upon all of us to confront and condemn this harmful rhetoric and physical violence against our transgender, non-binary, gender expansive, and gender non-confirming community members, with intentional focus on trans youth and students who are experiencing group violence in schools; and

Whereas, in December 2024, City Council funded a LGBTQ2SIA+ Mental Health Program to support the work of a community-based organization that delivers direct, affirming, and holistic mental health services to support the wellbeing of LGBTQ2SIA+ individuals; and

Whereas, in 2025, the City of Minneapolis awarded a mini-grant to QueerSpace Collective who supported trans youth mental health by reducing social isolation by fostering peer and mentor connections, building resilience through skill-building, and increasing self-confidence by trying new things in a safe and affirming environment; and

Whereas, in 2025, the City of Minneapolis awarded a mini-grant to the Family Tree Clinic that planned and hosted an event for trans youth to provide them with support and let them know they are cared for and

appreciated. They had gender-affirming activities, books and care packages for participants and a local resource directory available; and

Honoring Dave Bicking for his years of activism and service to improve the lives of the people of Minneapolis.

Whereas, Dave Bicking has been a widely respected Southside Minneapolis resident, small business owner, and activist dedicated to promoting peace and justice for decades; and

Whereas, Dave is recognized for working with passion, love and generosity to support and inspire community members, elected policy makers and organizations working for positive change in Minneapolis; and

Whereas, Dave ran two campaigns for the Minneapolis City Council for Ward 9, coming in second both times with 30% of the votes in 2005 and 27% in 2009; and

Whereas, Dave assisted and defended activists in 2008 by securing bail and helping provide legal defense for eight young people charged with terrorism for planning protests during the Republican National convention in Saint Paul; and

Whereas, Dave has consistently acted in solidarity with fellow activists and was one of the first people to reach out and help the “Antiwar 23” whose homes were raided by the FBI in 2010; and

Whereas, Dave owned and operated the Powderhorn Garage, an auto repair business in South Minneapolis, where he provided apprenticeship opportunities and was acknowledged as incredibly

supportive and a great teacher, and where it was said he never had to advertise because he had a loyal and beloved base of customers; and

Whereas, Dave has been a powerful advocate for strong, independent civilian oversight of the Minneapolis Police Department and served on the City of Minneapolis Civilian Review Authority from 2008-2010, where he worked to improve the city's police accountability and oversight systems; and

Whereas, following the destruction of Walker United Methodist Church in 2012, when a number organizations lost their offices, Dave purchased the building at 4200 Cedar Avenue South and created a welcoming space for them and the community that has been maintained ever since, with space for many organizations including Community United Against Police Brutality (CUAPB), Woman Against Military Madness, Vets for Peace, the Anti-War Committee, the Green Party of Minnesota, the Minnesota Immigrant Rights Action Committee, and the Climate Justice Committee; and

Whereas, Dave has served as secretary and vice president of CUAPB for the past 8 years and chair of its Committee for Professional Policing; and

Whereas, in 2016 and 2017, Dave helped lead the ultimately unsuccessful campaign and legal battle for a ballot measure to require Minneapolis police to carry their own professional liability insurance; and

Whereas, Dave helped secure the Minnesota Department of Human Rights and Department of Justice consent decrees to address ongoing problems with policing in Minneapolis; and

Whereas, Dave entered hospice care in March of 2026 and died on April 4, 2026; and

Whereas, many throughout our city are deeply grateful for Dave's sage wisdom, sense of humor, kindness and love for his family, his friends, and the people of the city he loved;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by The City Council of The City of Minneapolis:

That the Mayor and City Council do hereby present this Honorary Resolution in recognition of their sincere gratitude and recognition for the many contributions made by David Bicking to the City of Minneapolis.
