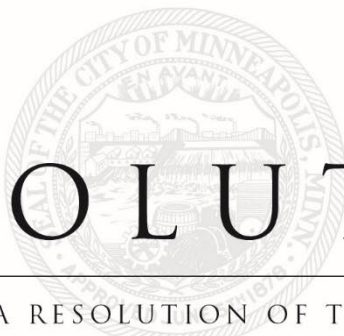

2026 DISABILITY PRIDE MONTH

- Whereas: Disability Pride Month is celebrated in July to acknowledge that the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) was signed into law on July 26, 1990; and
- Whereas: Thousands of Minneapolis residents who have disabilities live, work, learn, and play in the City of Minneapolis; and
- Whereas: People with disabilities are valued and essential members of the City of Minneapolis, contributing to its economy, arts, and sports communities; and
- Whereas: People with disabilities have intersectional identities that improve communities and enhance cultures through their lived experiences; and
- Whereas: The City of Minneapolis acknowledges the long history of discrimination against Minneapolis residents with disabilities and recognizes the decades of activism and advocacy by the disability community, including the City of Minneapolis’s Advisory Committee on People with Disabilities which was established in 1976; and
- Whereas: The City of Minneapolis acknowledges that the lives of people with disabilities are worth celebrating this month and every month, and that protections under the ADA must be preserved for generations to come;

That the Mayor and City Council do hereby recognize and celebrate July 2026 as Disability Pride Month in the City of Minneapolis.
